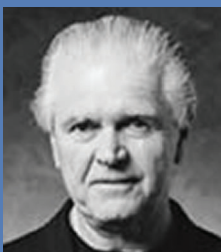
Professor Ralph McInerny, Ph.D.

The papal encyclical *Humanae vitae* was published on July 25, 1968, provoking a dramatic response. Today, many Catholics know only of the encyclical's proscription against contraception. Very few properly understand the beauty or the full range of Paul VI's prophetic teaching, as an essential element of the consistent defense of life and the joyful celebration of married sexuality, later elaborated in John Paul II's Theology of the Body.

This conference will present an explanation of the encyclical, with attention to the primacy of conscience, the Theology of the Body, 'reproductive' technologies and women's health, and the intimate connection between contraception and abortion.
